



Y7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium

Last year, the Academy received £22,154 in funding from the Y7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium. This year, the Academy expects to receive £22,154 from the Y7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-Up Premium.

Literacy Intervention Strategy	Targeted pupils, in Years 7 with a score below 100 in Reading KS2 SATS, who have low levels of literacy receive extra lessons to accelerate their progress. Supporting this intervention programme is the Accelerated Reader Programme which seeks to instil in pupils a love of reading. This scheme is heavily promoted within school and is timetabled in conjunction with English lessons. The pupils who did not “catch-up” will continue to receive intervention from Numeracy 1-to-1, Lexia, Reading Recovery and will receive intervention through Maths lessons and English lessons until they are where they should be.
